Why build a wind farm?

The Scottish Government has recently updated its targets for renewable energy, now aiming to produce the equivalent of 50% of Scotland's electricity demand from renewable sources by 2015. There is also a target to meet 100% of Scotland's electricity demand from renewable sources by 2020.

Onshore wind is expected to continue to play a key role in meeting energy needs in both Scotland and the rest of the UK.

The development, construction and operation of a wind farm offers benefits both to the landowners involved and the wider community:

- Reduction in CO₂ emissions and thereby giving a general environmental benefit to us all
- Income from farm diversification
- Employment and revenue into other businesses in the local area and wider economy
